The Boys of River Bourgeois

The River Bourgeois War Memorial stands today as a tribute to the young men of the community who went off to war at a youthful age to defend their country and its honor.

The memorial was erected on the #4 Highway overlooking the picturesque waters of River bourgeois and speaks volumes of a community, which takes pride in its ideals of citizenship and faith. According to the May 8, 1954 issue of the River Round Up Marie Boyd reported as



follows: "For some time now we have been thinking of getting some kind of Memorial in remembrance of the boys of River Bourgeois who gave up their lives in defence of their country during the first and

second World Wars. We're always being asked why someone doesn't send the River Bourgeois news to the papers. We decided it might be a good idea to do that and in this way raise funds for the Memorial."

Today the War Memorial stands guard over "The River" and has inscribed on its face the names of those who gave their lives in both Wars. It lies in close proximity to the old River Bourgeois Ballfield, no doubt a place where many of them enjoyed the game of baseball.

Many of us can only wonder what was happening in the lives of these boys when they went off to war and as well wonder what lives they would have lead had fate allowed them to return home after service for their country.

To these men we show our gratitude by dedicating this second issue of The River Round Up. May their spirit and enthusiasm remain alive and well and may we who owe our lives today to their sacrifices pause and remember them for their diligence and sacrifice. Their goal was peace and their legacy is peace.
