

Richmond County Seniors Club

Almost all surrounding communities have a seniors club where members gather to hold monthly meetings, Sunday night card games, periodic cribbage game, mini bingos and special events.

Monica Stone and Bob Pettigrew from the RB Senior's Club are representatives on the Richmond County Council for Seniors. Meetings are held in different areas and discussions deal mainly with senior's rights. Information received from the National Federation is forwarded to all members such as help available from the government, etc. The main issue of concern to seniors now focuses on the rights of grandparents. A resolution to the effect that when a divorce occurs, grandparents still have visiting rights to children was sent to the convention in Sydney. Items of interest to seniors presently are the Low Income Fuel Assistance Program from the NS Government. This program offers a one-time \$50.00 rebate to users of propane or heating oil. It is available to seniors on Guaranteed Income Supplement and/or Spouses Allowance as well as persons receiving Social Assistance, single parents with net income below \$9,500 or a family with a net income below \$16,500. For information and application forms call toll free 1-800-670-4357. Deadline to submit applications is January 31, 2001. There is also a Property Tax Rebate available in the Province of Nova Scotia for qualifying seniors. Toll free number is 1-877-296-9338 for information.

Christmas Bird Count

The CBC for St. Peter's & area was held on December 27. It is the oldest and largest wildlife survey in the world, started by the Audubon Society in 1900. Individual birds and species are counted in a 15-mile diameter circle over a 24-hour period. Results are tabulated by the NS Bird Society for international records. The local count was started by Eva and Murdock Digout of St. Peters with the help of A.O. MacLean, Katherine Robertson and Aloysius Burke in the 1950's. This year, Billy (Murdock's son) organized the count and Murdock served lunch to the field birders. About 60 species were counted including a rare Ivory Gull.
