There were nickels clanging in the jukebox, snapping of spruce gum, spruce beer that Charlie made and laughter everywhere.

Charlie and his wife Genny ran the restaurant and put up with us even when we got real loud. For many of us, these are the sights and sounds of our teenage years in River Bourgeois.



<u>Editors Note:</u> Charlie's son Carl tells us the restaurant was opened from approximately 1930 to 1967. It was the first restaurant in River Bourgeois to have electricity, which was obtained from a generator.
