Joe & Margaret Bouchard: Love Story



Joseph William was born Sept. 15th, 1912 the youngest of ten children to Grace and Elias Bouchard of Cannes. Margaret Mary was born Jan. 6th, 1915 the third of six children to William and Justine Beranger of River Bourgeois. At the young age of seventeen Margaret moved to Halifax and for the next ten years worked in the operating room at the VG hospital sterilizing operating equipment. Meanwhile Joe remained in RB doing some fishing and working for the Dept. of Highways. The summer of 1939 Margaret came home on holidays and Joe (now quite a debonair) began courting her. Following two years of only seeing his true love for a month each year Joe packed his bags and moved to Halifax. Two years later Margaret and Joe were married on February 9th, 1943 at St. Mary's Basilica in Halifax.

In July of that year Joe's mother, Grace, who was alone and seventy-five years old, asked Joe and Margaret to return home to RB and live with her. Margaret's cooking must have been wonderful as Grace passed away on Dec. 8th, 1967 on her 100th birthday. Joe and Margaret had six children, Mary Gladys now living in Mississauga, Richard in

Toronto, Anita in Plymouth, Arthur and Emily in RB and Edmond who passed away in infancy. They also have twelve grandchildren and three great-grandsons Isaac, Dylan and Brandon and soon to be one more.

Anita recalls a story that her parents told the children growing up, that they would have married two weeks after they started dating, as they were so much in love. The children remember their mother always greeting their father at the door with open arms and there was always lots of love in the household. Holding hands was a natural thing to do when they went walking. In 1952 Joe went to work in St. Peters at MacLean's Store. Since there was no union he was required to do many tasks including, off-load trucks, stock the shelves and cashier; however, Joe's favourite part of the job was flirting with all the ladies. Joe was forced to retire in 1974 when MacLean's closed its doors: however he was quite contented to stay home with Margaret. Joe & Margaret had a brand new granddaughter Amanda just up the hill that they could spoil and Joe's friend Steve Smith was now retired so they spent countless hours doing just "nothing". Joe and Margaret were finding the winters difficult to cope with at home so in 1987 they packed their belongings and moved to the new RB Senior's home. Here Joe could walk back and forth to the store across the street for supplies for anyone who had difficulty getting around. The swing in the front of the building was permanently occupied by Joe and Margaret holding hands watching the sights.

In June of 2001 they could no longer take care of themselves and moved to the Villa in St. Peters. Here there was always plenty of entertainment and Joe had lots of people to play cards with. He regularly takes quarters from daughter Emily and son Art, Valerie Boyd, many others and mine. Joe still remains a ladies man and loves to give hugs, however not during lent. (He will receive hugs during this time but will not give.) He is grateful Margaret is not the jealous type. Joe still cherishes Margaret as much

today as he did over sixty years ago and even with Margaret's failing health he still continues to take care of her. Next month, Joe and Margaret will celebrate sixty wonderful years of marriage and RB congratulates them and wishes them many more years of continuous health and happiness. On their anniversary their granddaughter Tracy Wynands will be married in Australia. She chose that special day because of the love her grandparents shared and hopes her marriage will have the same fate. If you drop by to visit make sure you have quarters to play Forty-Five's.
