Edward Joseph was born December 1st, 1917 the fifth of eleven children to David and Agnes Sampson. Florence (Sweet) Adeline was born on April 9th, 1922 the last of seven children to John J. (The Diver) Sampson and Josephine (Beranger), all in the Church Point area of River Bourgeois. In 1929 at age seven, Flo lost her mother to cancer. Her father John tended the children until he became ill himself. While she was still a teenager, their home caught fire and all was lost. Flo recalls the neighbours carrying her bedridden father from the burning house on his mattress to safety at Minnie Sampson's.

Following school, Edward went to work on the construction of the Cabot Trail on North Mountain. In 1942, he ventured out to Halifax where he would spend the next forty-two years working for Reardon Paint and Glass (now known as Pittsburgh Paints). Flo also went to Halifax and worked in the Dockyard office until the end of the war. When her job was eliminated after the war, Flo packed her bags and moved to Toronto where she took a practical nurse course at Ryerson. She spent the next four years working at the Queen Street Mental Hospital. In the

meantime, Edward was suffering from writer's cramps and burning the phone lines to his true love in Toronto so in 1949 Flo retuned to Nova Scotia and on November 10th of that year they were married at St. Thomas Aquinas Church in Halifax. Seven children soon followed: David who lives in RB; Paul in Toronto; Louise and Linda in Halifax; John in Milton, Ont.; Joan in Georgetown, Ont. and Peter in PEI. Now the family has expanded to include fourteen grandchildren.

While living in Halifax, Flo spent most of her time as a homemaker but also worked part time at the Halifax Infirmary. She was a member of St. Michael's CWL for 25 years and was actively involved in the annual fall fair held at the church each year. Many years ago, she was "recruited" by Father MacLean to teach grade 4 religion at one of the local schools. After she moved back to the River, she continued to teach religion at the River Bourgeois Consolidated School. While living in Halifax, Edward spent his leisure time gardening, working at church functions and could often be found at the Forum when a good wrestling match came to town.

In 1984, their son David decided to build a home for his family on the Church Point and along with his Uncle James's help, built one large enough so his parents could live upstairs. Since their return to the River, Edward has passed his days away by doing stained glass, woodworking and gardening, while Flo dabbled in quilt making, knitting and cooking up a storm. These days due to Edward's failing health they don't wander to far. Flo enjoys her computer games, surfing the Internet and makes great fudge. Edward is a Toronto Blue Jay fan and does not miss a televised game. They enjoy the many visits from their family and are looking forward to their yearly visit from Flo's sister, Louise, from Massachusetts. We wish you all the health and happiness you both

Donna Foshner, daughter of the late Lena Sampson Gordon of Church Point has asked if we would pass a very important message to all boaters in the local area. Donna and her husband, Earl, took early retirement, built a cottage and looked forward to really enjoying life. Their favourite recreation was sailing. After spending 32 years of boating they thought they knew all there was to know about safety.

Just about one year ago they went sailing in Barrachois Harbour on one of these days that are ideal. Earl was taking down the jib because they were going to tack when he was hit by the sail which knocked him over. He was not a strong swimmer; he tried to get back to the boat while Donna tried to manoeuvre it near him to no avail. She finally turned to grab for one of the 10 life jackets stored in the boat and called for help but when she turned around he was no longer in sight. Search & Rescue and the local fisherman came very quickly but were unable to revive him.

She is sharing this painful memory with us to ask everyone who gets in their boat to remember that life jackets do not help if you don't wear them. Be Careful!

In our last issue we reported that we had raised over \$5,000. One month later we are very happy to report that we have \$13,000+. This has been accomplished by a very generous donation of \$5090 by Nova Scotia Power Inc. (a match to our sum raised at that time); \$500+ raised at our last pub night; \$300+ ticket sales from a beautiful painting of the old lighthouse by Susan Pottie, which was won by Gerard Touesnard; local donations and a very successful fundraiser in Dartmouth organized by our own Garvie Samson. Approx. 150 RB natives and wannabees raised \$2200. Thank you to all our donors and to our local musicians Ed Pottie, Henry Martell, Wayne Bona and Lighthouse Committee chair, Carl Grimes who travelled up to help out. We hear Donnie Potties little brother Wayne was great on the drums.

At the May RBCSS meeting the Committee unanimously moved that construction could begin immediately. The contract of \$21,800 (includes taxes) was awarded to the lowest bidder Gerald LeBlanc (Charlotte's little boy) of the South Side who will start constructing as soon as the ground is dry enough.

Another pub night will be held at the TLC on June 21st. Remember the door proceeds goes to the reconstruction but RBCSS benefits from the bar sales.
