Raymond & Bridget Robertson



Raymond Joseph was born on Oct 2nd, 1925 in Cannes the last child of Fred and Katie Ann Robertson. After attending school in Cannes, Raymond joined the army in 1942 at the age of seventeen. Following basic training in B.C. he was promptly shipped overseas, first to England followed by Holland, Belgium and Germany. While in Hohenwald, Germany (means High Forest) a tank passed him on a bridge and only later in the day did he learn that it was his friend Arthur Beranger from RB. Two weeks before the war ended Raymond was wounded in the arm in Germany and was relocated to Belgium to recuperate. He returned to Canada (Kingston, Ontario) on the *Ille De France* and left the army as quickly as he had joined.

Meanwhile on April 5th, 1927 in Kingston, Bridget Margaret Clark was born. Bridget was the third of eight children who lived in a big old house that also included her grandparents. Bridget attended St. John's School, St. Vincent Academy and Notre Dame Convent (a boarding school operated by the nuns). She then went on to Rockwood Ontario Hospital where she studied to be a nurse's aid and was employed there for many years. She also worked at several stores around town. In April 1949 at a friend's house, Bridget met Raymond and six months later on Oct 1st at Saint Mary's Cathedral in Kingston they wed. They adopted three children: Nine-month-

old Peter who now resides in Slovakia, one-year-old Cathy who now lives in Halifax and ten-day-old Michael who is in Toronto. They have one grandchild, ten-year-old Matthew.

Raymond found himself at the infamous Kingston Penitentiary where most notorious murderers are held. He worked there as a security guard and there were many times when his life was in danger. In the meantime, Bridget became a homemaker and took care of the children while sewing, knitting and painting in her spare time. Two years later, Raymond left the prisoners behind and took his chances with the dogs as he went to work as a postman. For the next twenty years he would take the bus to the start of his route only to find as many as ten dogs waiting for him and they would accompany him on his daily routine. In 1974, Raymond hung up his mailbag for the last time, left the dogs behind and moved to the old homestead in RB. Raymond was not quite ready to retire so he went to work for a couple of years for Pinkerton Guards at the oil refinery in Port Hawkesbury.

In 2002, Raymond was awarded the Dutch Medal for his service in Holland during the war. These medals were issued on the fiftieth anniversary of the liberation of Holland to all the Canadian soldiers who made this happen. Also in 2002, Raymond found his long lost friend Clyde Shepherd, who was originally from Truro and had served with him in England in 1942. Although Raymond searched unsuccessfully for many years he never forgot his friend. Thanks to research done by Ethel Bona and her cousin Annabel, Clyde, who now resides in Quispamsis, NB and Raymond now reminisce (after 60 yrs) by phone about the good old days. Bridget continues her hobbies of portrait painting and has many displayed in their home. She is particularly proud of her portrait of the late Tara Lynne Touesnard. Raymond himself is also quite artistic. He draws on wood, cuts the photo out and paints them. These days they can be seen sitting on their sun porch enjoying the view

or reading a book. They enjoy their life to the fullest and we wish you, Raymond and Bridget many more years of health and happiness.


