Da-vid's (as he is affectionately called) favorite time as a child was going for a ride in Davy Burke's truck. At age sixteen, Da-vid wandered onto the road and was hit by a car, both legs were crushed from the knees down and doctors told his mom that he would never walk again. He pushed himself around by holding onto a chair for several months. One day he had had enough and let the chair go and walked straighter than ever before. He also learned to run for the first time in his life and from that day on ran everywhere he went.

Following the accident, Da-vid became obsessed with cars and soon could identify any model. His biggest hero is his brother-in-law Hughie who opened an auto repair shop in the same field. Da-vid now spends most of his days keeping the staff in line and supervising when Hughie is out on business. He

especially likes l'autre (other) *Joe á Jimmy* better known to us as John Sampson (son of *Joe á Jimmy*) as he taught him to speak English.

Da-vid lives with mom and enjoys visits from his brothers and sisters. He is a true gentleman and never fails to kiss the ladies on the cheek when they depart. Edward Alexander was born on April 7th, 1945 to Allan and Annie (Burke) Touesnard of Church Point. He grew up on his parent's farm where there were plenty of chickens, pigs, beef and milking cows. Following his schooling, Edward took a year off and worked on the lake boats but after being cold once too often he headed straight to Fredericton, New Brunswick where he attended the Forest Ranger School. After graduation in 1967 he was employed by Lands and Forest in Truro. Four years later, Edward was transferred to the St. Peters detachment where he worked until his retirement in 1996.

On September 14th, 1974 Edward married the love of his life, the beautiful Florence Cash from Irish Cove. They settled in the old homestead on Church Point and had five children in the next seven years Amy now a teacher in Ottawa, Annette working on a farm in Truro, Andrew a recent graduate from Forest Ranger School and Alaine & Margaret at home. One granddaughter, Evany is the apple of their eye.

In the meantime, Edward trained his dog *Dan* for Search and Rescue and traveled around the Maritime's in this capacity. Sometimes he was airlifted to wooded areas for several days and weeks in search of missing hunters, hikers etc. Florence would indicate on a map, the whereabouts of their Dad to the children and consequently they became very proficient in geography.

Edward's dad, Allan, was still maintaining a small farm when Edward and Florence returned to RB to live and they opted to continue farming following his death in 1975. They kept pigs, chickens, turkeys and beef. They purchased a large parcel of land in Seaview and, following the land clearing, built a large barn. Florence, with the kids in tow, did her share in building this structure. It now houses forty head of cattle along with seven calves including a set of twins. Eighteen more are due to give birth in the next weeks. One of the calves was born in minus twenty-one degree temperatures. She shivered for a few minutes but quickly adjusted to the cold.

Edward is semi retired (he works 60 instead of 90 hours) and along with farming he still does contract work in silviculture. Edward also just completed a six-year stint as President of Richmond County 4H Council and was a 4H leader in RB for many years. Edward and Florence we all wish you many more years of happiness and hope you have many more babies-oops calves in the future. *Sharon Chilvers*

Excerpts from the River Round Up March 18th, 1957: "Steve Landry who is in "Radar" with the Air Force in Beaverbank spent two weeks with his parents, Mr. & Mrs. Peter Landry of South R.B. During the time Peter was at home a hockey game was organized with Cheticamp. Our school bus and driver Davy Touesnard took some 40 hockey players and fans. They left R.B. about 1.30 and arrived at Cheticamp about 5 where they had supper. Mimi who is down at the garage has left me an account of the game, but all I see on it are the R.B. players, the R.B. guys who got the goals, and no sign of the Cheticamp crowd at all. Apparently she wasn't too interested with what the Cheticamp players did. As Eddie says "It figgers".

Anyway here is the one sided account. River Bourgeois Goal-Peter Pottie, Defence-Georgie Boyd, George Digout, Stanley MacPhee, Rennie Fougere, Lawrence Pottie. Forwards-Pat Burke, Russ Fougere, John McNeil, Hervey Boyd, Steve Landry, Peter Burke, Gilbert Burke, Bucky Samson, Maynard Boyd, Stan Digout, Gerald Robertson, Eddie Fougere, Dickie Burke. Goals for R.B. Pat Burke 4, Russ Fougere 3, Hervey Boyd 2, Bucky Samson 1, Stan Digout 1, Steve Landry 1, Peter Burke 1. Now that is Mimi's account, but I know that Cheticamp players got 6 goals as the game ended 13-6. They left Cheticamp about midnight arriving home in the wee hours of the morning. Everyone reported a grand time and Davy the finest of drivers for a trip."...
