Rivière-Bourgeois

Rivière–Bourgeois est situé dans le sud de l'île du Cap-Breton sur la route 4, une trentaine (30) de milles de la Chaussée de Canceau (Canso Causeway) et 5 milles de St. Pierre (St. Peters).

Les différentes localités du village commencant de l'est sont: Rivière-Tillard, le Grand-Goulet et la Briquers, la Pointe de l'Église (Church Point) où se trouve l'Église et pendant 30 ans la dernière école; le Bord-du-Nord (North Side), le Bord-du-Sud (Southside), les Étangs (Richard's Pond), Thibeauville et la Fausse-Baie (False Bay).

On ne sait pas la date de l'arrivée des premiers colons mais en 1752, le Sieur de la Roque mentionnait la Rivière-Bourgeois et nous savons qu'envers 1770, on trouvait des habitants aux Étangs près de l'entrée de Rivière-Bourgeois.

Vers 1805 on trouve les noms Acadien; Landry, Boucher, Samson, LeBlanc, et plus tard (1811) Dugas, Bourque, Fougère, Pitre, Babin, Richard, Digout, Boudrot (Boudreau), Bona, Pâté, McPhee, MacDonald. Vers 1864 Bisset, Boyd, Béranger, Mac Lean, Robertson, Thibeau, Le Vesconte, Grimes. Les derniers noms ne sont pas Acadien et aujourd'hui on trouve beaucoup de noms Écossais, Irlandais, Anglais etc.

En 1869 la paroisse est divenu St. Jean Baptiste. Le premier curé était Père Guillame LeBlanc et à present l'an 2004 Pére Reginald Currie est curé.

Nous voulons dire 'Bienvenue' à tous qui visitent Rivière-Bourgeois en 2004 et surtout à ceux/celles qui viennent pour le Congrès Mondial des Acadiens.

Catherine Touesnard



Marie "Catherine" Alma was born September 29th, 1928 on Church Point,the youngest of ten children of Emile (*the first Touesnard to live in RB*) and Mary (Sampson) Touesnard. Catherine attended school in the east end of River Bourgeois and completed her grade ten. It was necessary to board in St. Peter's at that time if you wanted to further your education and her parents did not have the funds. Catherine has fond memories of her childhood and loved schooling. Her father who was born in France taught her to write in French and she was so proficient at it that even to this day she corresponds in French with her father's family in France who she personally never met.

Catherine remembers her father taking her older brother Allan at age eleven to work on the Lake boats. After several years Allan had saved enough money to start a farm across from the family home and never set foot on a boat again. Emile would also make and repair sails for the tall ships when they docked in St. Peter's. The Touesnard family would take the rowboat over to Bistouri Island every Sunday to dig clams. In 1947, following her education, Catherine went to Hamilton, Ontario to assist her sister Rigina who had a new baby. She returned to Nova Scotia to work as a housemaid in Halifax at the Sisters of the Sacred Heart. In the early fifties, she came back to RB to take care of her ailing parents. Her mom passed away in 1958 and her dad died in 1966. During those years Catherine worked part time doing housework in many homes in RB. She recalls one place where they made her wash the clothespins before putting the clothes on the line. The most memorable homes she worked at were those of Leo & Theresa Landry and Emily & Henry Fougere of the Southside following the birth of their children.

Catherine suffered from cancer in 1981 and following her chemotherapy treatments visited the sainte Anne de Beaupré Shrine in Quebec. Being of very strong faith, Catherine believed it was a miracle that she was cured and has returned to the Shrine every July for the past twenty- three years. Her favorite time was the millennium year when there was a spectacular show called "Christmas in July" to celebrate the 2000 birthday of Jesus. It was breathtaking she recalls. Catherine loves the sevenday excursion by bus and spending time with her friend Rose Sampson from L'Ardoise.

These days Catherine enjoys reading & writing letters and visits from Florence. We the people of River Bourgeois wish you, Catherine, good health and many more trips to St. Anne's. *Sharon Chilvers*
