# Marie & Conrad Fougere



Conrad Ambrose was born May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1946 the 8<sup>th</sup> of 10 children to Evelyn (Pottie) & Sam Fougere of the Southside. He attended the Cannes School which just happened to be located a few hundred yards from his home. Since the lavatory (outhouse) for the school was located across the road, Conrad would jump the fence and run home to the more familiar commode. In 1954 he moved on to the newly built Stella Maris School on the Church Point where he completed his grade eleven. Conrad worked clearing brush for the power lines before joining Stora in 1965. At sixteen years of age while attending school he became lovesick with a beautiful young lady from the Church Point named Marie.

Stella (Marie) was born on August 28<sup>th</sup>, 1948 the last of seven children to Beatrice (Landry) & Charlie Landry of the Church Point. When she was ready to start school at age five Sister Josephine suggested to Beatrice to keep Marie home longer as she had enough five year olds crying to go home already in her class so she started school at age seven. She quickly caught up with the children her own age by double grading and after completing the tenth grade

worked at Dino's Restaurant in Port Hawkesbury. She also worked at Sears in Halifax in the candy and credit departments. At the tender age of thirteen Marie became infatuated with a young handsome gent from the Southside named Conrad.

Conrad & Marie were married on December 26<sup>th</sup>, 1966 by Father Marinelli at St. John the Baptist Church. They were the first couple in our church to receive wine at a wedding Mass. As they left the altar Conrad turned to Marie and in his dainty voice said "You could have left me some". They went to live on Church Point and Conrad claims he was the first South-sider to move to Church Point while still living. They had three sons: Scott who sadly passed away Feb. 2005 of cancer, Kevin who lives in Calgary and Mark in Halifax. They also have three wonderful daughters-in-law Carolyn, Tammy & Jennifer and two precious granddaughters Jillian and Ava.

Marie was a stay at home mom to her boys while becoming involved in the community. She was President of the Home and School Association and for twelve years took care of the Fillion children while their mom taught school. In 1984 Marie returned to school to obtain her GED. For the past thirteen years Marie and her friend Florence Touesnard have been delivering Meals on Wheels. She also organized several pot luck suppers for the community festivals and is notorious for baking and cooking for the neighbours, the sick and the shut-ins. Conrad served several years on Parish Council. He worked as a millwright at Stora for thirty-seven years before retiring in May, 2003.

Sports played an integral part in the Fougere family. Conrad began coaching baseball in the minor leagues in 1970. He was President of the Richmond Minor Baseball League while coaching the River Bourgeois Schooners. He was also on the Executive of the Richmond Amateur Baseball Association and served seven years as President. He would take his boys with him in the dugout while he coached and they soon learned the game. When the weather was

bad the children would play ball in the trailer using a sponge ball and when it was sunny they would play imaginary ball outside much to the delight of neighbour James Sampson who would sit at the window watching the kids run around the nonexisting bases. Hockey was also a pivotal sport that the children played and dad coached. Conrad was a member of the Board of Directors for the Richmond Arena when it was first built. The funds ran out before its final completion so the coaches and some players worked diligently in preparation for the hockey season. Aluminium pie plates were placed under each bulb in order to reflect more light onto the ice. A tractor hauling two barrels of water was used to flood the rink each night and everyone took their turns doing this. Fundraising to pay for ice rental and uniforms was also part of the job as kids traveled to compete in Victoria, Inverness and Antigonish Counties. Conrad was the president of the Richmond Minor Hockey while Marie was the unofficial secretary, telephone answering machine and did all other duties that come with being the wife and mother in a sports oriented family.

Marie & Conrad are kept busy these days being the caretakers of the Funeral Home and cleaning of the church. Conrad spends much time in the summer mowing in the graveyard and cleaning the tombstones. Marie and friend Florence often have to pick up flowers and garbage that have been moved around the graveyard by the wind and the crows. One day they notice a crow picking up a newly laid flower in its beak and carrying it of into the woods. They suspected that he was doing some courting. Conrad is a member of Branch 47 Legion and is always on call when brother Hubert starts a new project and needs his expertise in renovating. Marie & Conrad enjoy visiting their children and grandchildren. Marie & Conrad, the people of the community owe both of you a huge debt of gratitude for all you do and we all wish you many more years of love and happiness. Sharon Chilvers
