


The River Round Up

Two major events happened in the world in September, 1939. World War II broke out in Europe and River Bourgeois welcomed Marie (Mimi) Eleanor, the second of four children to Cecilia (Boyd) & Walter Fougere. Mimi having three brothers and six male cousins living next door quickly became one of the boys in any and all sporting events.

She attended Cannes School which was near her home until the ninth grade; then went to St. Peter's High for grade ten. Her uncle, Cameron Boyd gave Mimi and her friends a ride to school and in the afternoon they would start walking home in hopes of getting a lift. In 1954 the Stella Maris School opened so everyone from RB returned for grade eleven before going back to St. Peters for grade twelve. Because she was only sixteen graduating, she was not eligible to enter nursing school so she went to work for her dad at his garage/store.

The year at dad's garage was not without its share of eventful episodes and usually the recipient was Stan MacPhee. Stan had purchased a new Volkswagen and wanted to have the oil changed before heading to Halifax to see his true love so Mimi emptied the used oil and as per his instructions inserted the required 2 ½ quarts. When checking the

oil it read well above the allowable limit. Mimi, panicked and since her dad was not around, instructed Stan to take his new car to Roy O'Melia's garage, where Roy soon discovered that the transmission fuel was empty and the oil had double its quantity. Needless to say Roy took every occasion possible to remind Mimi of her failure as a mechanic. Stan was also the recipient of another incident when he accidentally turned the stool he was sitting on in the store as Mimi was walking into the door with a screwdriver in her hand hitting him in the ear and puncturing his eardrum. To this day he claims he has to block his ear when he blows his nose. Stan chose to take his car business elsewhere.

In the fall of 1957, following a failed career as a mechanic, Mimi began the shortest nursing career in history at St. Martha's Hospital. She started Monday and finished on Friday the same week. In May of 1958 Mimi found her true calling when she began a career in banking that lasted more than forty years. She spent 21 years at the Royal Bank in St. Peters, starting as a steno and ended as a Branch Administration Officer. In 1979 Mimi moved to the River Bourgeois Credit Union as the Manager and remained there until her retirement in 1997.

At age eleven she took over the duties of scorekeeper and statistician at ball games, a position her uncle. John Boyd had held for many years. She was a member of the Executive of the Rich. Co. Amateur Baseball Association and was chosen Executive of the Year in 1970. Mimi was equally interested in hockey and Jim Boucher's Rink was her second home. She often refereed hockey games and frequently had to break up fights. Mimi recalls a face-off with Douglas Landry of Lakeside and Peter Burke; she went between them to drop the puck, they dropped their gloves to fight and she saw her life flash before her eyes. Sometimes it was so cold on the rink that her feet froze and on several occasions Jim would rub her feet to thaw them out for the next game. She travelled with the hockey and baseball teams to out of town games. She remains a sports

fanatic and watches mostly any sport on television especially her beloved Maple Leafs.

Mimi served fifteen years on the Strait Richmond Hospital Board and Strait Richmond Foundation Board. She has been treasurer of the Parish Council and has collected the church envelopes since 1989. She is also a member of the CWL and the St. Peters' unit of the Canadian Cancer Society. She has also been a participant in many skits for the RB festivals.

Mimi you have served our community well and we all wish you a long & healthy retirement and hope you see the Toronto Maple Leafs win the Stanley Cup again in your lifetime. *Sharon Chilvers*.

Festival Committee had a very successful year and showed a healthy profit. Bar Committee works at each event at the TLC that alcohol is served. Bingo proved very lucrative for most of the year however winter weather conditions resulted in less than anticipated profits. Property Service continues to do repairs to the TLC with the replacement of three windows, new locks were installed and the problems with our water purifier have finally been solved. A much needed ride on lawnmower was purchased. Funeral Home's interior was repainted, new flooring installed in the kitchen and drapes were replaced. Funding from the Nova Scotia Government enabled us to employ someone during the summer to help with the festival and maintaining the grounds. Special thanks to our devoted Treasurer and Secretary.
