Lorraine & David Gates



David Fulton was born on August 3rd, 1947, the only child of Audrey (Mattinson) & Harry Gates of Yarmouth. David went to a one room school until the 2nd grade when, for a lack of a teacher he went to a two-room school in Port Maitland. At age fourteen he and his parents moved to Goshen where David went to Sherbrooke High School. In 1966 David took a heavy body mechanical trade. In 1964 while out with friends he met the love of his life Lorraine.

Lorraine Jeanette was born June 25th, 1947, the second of four children to Elva (Manson) & Robert Cameron of Country Harbour. Lorraine attended Country Harbour Elementary School and then on to Goldboro School. Following her schooling Lorraine went to work at the Royal George Hotel in Antigonish. At age seventeen she met her knight in shining armour David Gates.

David & Lorraine dated for five years before they wed on June 28th, 1969 at St. James United in Antigonish. Son Robbie who resides at home arrived in 1974 followed by daughter Candace who lives in Oyen, Alberta. Candace & husband Darrin have three children, Rielly, River-Dawn and Raynes.

In 1969 David went to work for Nova Scotia Light and Power. In 1977 the name was changed to Nova Scotia Power Commission but David continued to work for the company until his retirement in 1998. In 1977 they moved to River Bourgeois with their young family. Shortly after their arrival the Gates family began to make a very strong impact in this community. Lorraine became a 4H leader and taught the children food preparation, heritage, explorer and dog obedience. She served as a General Leader from 1997 to 2001, was on the Provincial 4H Council and is now serving as President of Richmond County 4H. David has also worked for many years with 4H Provincial levels. Lorraine has also made Lap Quilts for every single room at the Strait Regional Hospital, for the Villa and QE11 cancer unit. Recently while her daughter was in the hospital with her preemie baby, Lorraine knit thirteen quilts for all the hospital preemies.

David & Lorraine now spend much of their retirement summers traveling across Canada and the US in their RV. During their many excursions they have met with many memorable incidents, including a moose that refused to move from the center of the road, bears and other forms of wild life. The one that stands out the most is their trip to Stanley Park in Vancouver. With their daughter and her family with them, the son-in-law Darrin had been given directions to the park, however his friend failed to tell him that they had to drive thru the most famous shoddy street (East Hastings) of Vancouver. They saw more than they desired to see. David can be seen these days driving down the road in his famous pinkish coloured tractor heading out to clear woodland, tilling or wood chopping while Lorraine is out with 4H or taking care of funeral receptions.
