

Debbie & Michael Landry



Michael Charles was born on November 12th, 1956, the third of six children to Dorothy (Sampson) & Alcantra Landry of the Church Point. Michael attended the local school before completing his education in St. Peter's. Not a scholar by choice, Michael chose a different path and went to work with his dad doing road construction. He also worked for a number of years hauling pulp to Stora for John Neil MacLellan and Polegato Trucking of Louisdale. During this time his friend Bradley introduced him to his sister, the beautiful Debbie Boucher.

Deborah Ann was born on September 16th, 1959, the first of four children to Emily (Landry) & Joe Boucher of the Church Point. Debbie and her parents lived with her dad's parents in a rather large house that also served as a boarding house. Upon the death of her grandparents, dad Joe decided to reduce the size of the house for heating purposes. As each child arrived the house was made smaller (most people enlarge their home as the family increases). As a result of these renovations, Emily still complains about her small kitchen. Upon graduation from St. Peter's High in 1978, Debbie attended University of St. Anne's, in Church Point, Digby County and

graduated with a certificate in Secretarial Science (Bilingual) in 1980. While in high school she had met the handsome Michael Landry and continued to correspond with him while attending university.

On July 5th, 1980, Debbie & Michael were married at St. John the Baptist Church. They have three children: Matthew, who works in the North West Territories; Rebecca, in RB and Sarah, who recently returned home after graduating from NSCC in Halifax. Following their marriage, Debbie & Michael lived with her grandmother Beatrice Landry. In 1983, while awaiting the birth of their first child, they moved in their current abode.

Debbie went to work for four years at Shoppers World in Port Hawkesbury as a secretary and the closing of the company luckily corresponded with the birth of son Matthew. After the birth of Sarah, Debbie returned to work as the caretaker of the Post Office until 2003 when she took a job at Tim Hortons, where she remained until 2007, leaving for health reasons. These days she works part time at the school and at Foodland.

Michael has had several careers including being self-employed with a backhoe business, followed by a trucking venture for several years. He worked for several years at the quarry in Auld's Cove but had a desire to go work out west. In 2005, while searching the internet saw a position available in the North West Territories with Peter Kiewit & Sons Construction. On a whim he emailed his resume and within one hour they called and interviewed him over the phone and hired him immediately. He is a multiskilled operator, operating machinery at Diavik Diamond Mine in NWT, which is located on an island two hundred kilometres north of Yellowknife. Michael works for four weeks at a time then the company flies him home for two weeks. He does not get diamonds as a fringe benefit. When Michael made the decision to work out west in 2005 he left within hours. What he didn't know was that the

family had planned for weeks to have a surprise twenty-fifth anniversary celebration for Michael & Debbie the following week. The party had to be cancelled but they did get to keep some of the food.

Michael & Debbie have been very active in the community for many years. Michael is involved with baseball and he, along with Darren Stone, have upgraded and rebuilt the Bona field. Debbie became involved with the 4H and served as a leader for ten years teaching crafts, foods, advanced foods, woodworking & exploring. Debbie is a member of the CWL, Seniors Club and was instrumental in the start of the Youth Development in 2003. Amable & Ida May Bourque



Amable Isaac Bourque (Amable a Daille) was born on July 16th, 1889 to Isaie Bourque & Charlotte Boucher. Amable spent most of his life at sea, beginning at age 12, including pogie fishing in Glouster, Massachusetts and various parts of the Atlantic. He spent a few years on dredge boats and tugs with service in the war zone. He also fished lobster in a row boat with Tenis Dugas in the Black Head and Berry Head areas of St. Peter's Bay. In later years Amable acquired his own fishing boat powered by a single cylinder engine and fished lobster out of RB. He loved to tinker with this "pick a puck" engine whether it was in great working order or not. On January 29th, 1918, Amable married Ida May daughter of Armi Landry & Margaret Anne Bourque. Ida May was born November 24th, 1900 on the Southside and attended Cannes School. Upon their marriage they moved in their home on the Northside (now the home of son Gilbert & wife Patricia) where all of their fourteen children were born. Ida May loved to sit in her rocking chair by the window while enjoying visits from family and friends. Her homemade bread and molasses cookies

were always a treat, and none of her children can rival her soup or her baked haddock. Amable died in 1969 and Ida May in 1979 after fifty one years of marriage and 228 direct descendents. Their children were:
