Rose & Mark Merrick



Rose Marie was born October 20th, 1961, the third of seven children to Lucille (Martell) & Buddy Boudreau. Rose graduated in 1980 from St. Peter's High and attended Port Hawkesbury Vocational School for the next two years to study cosmetology. Following completion of her studies in 1982, she worked with Louise MacNeil Hairstyling in St. Peter's for two years. In 1984 she moved to Halifax in pursuit of the city life and to expand her career. There she worked for Sears Hair Design. While in Halifax she attended the Natal Day parade and fireworks and it was here that she met a tall blond named Mark. Fireworks were everywhere that day.

Mark Anthony was born on December 21st, 1961, the oldest of four children to Mike & Joan Merrick. Mark was an army "brat" (his dad was in the forces). The family moved often including stays in Kapiskasing, ON; Shilo, MN; and Shearwater. Mark comes from a long line of military men which includes his grandfather Flight Lieutenant Peter Merrick who was a fighter pilot on the committee

that organized the invasion of Normandy. Mark joined the reserves and served several years, leaving in 1987. It was in August of 1987 that his life changed forever when he took in the festivities of Natal Day and met the beautiful Rose Boudreau.

Two years later, on June 24th, 1989, Rose & Mark were wed at St. John the Baptist Church. At a wedding shower prior to their big day, Rose received a gift from Mark's parents and with it was an attached note that read: "He is all yours now." Mark was twenty-eight and was finally leaving the nest for the last time. They have two daughters: Robyn who is currently working in Halifax, and who will be working at the upcoming Canada Winter Games; and Meghan, a Richmond Academy student.

Rose & Mark have been very much involved in the community. Mark served for three years on the Board of Directors of RBCSS before Rose joined and she has been a member since 1998. Rose was a founding member of the Youth Development Group and is now serving as acting President of RBCSS. She also has been instrumental in the start-up of the brunches, the haunted house each Halloween, and is now busy organizing the Murder Mystery Night to take place on January 29th. William Fraser was born in 1885, the son of Angus & Mary (Fraser) Boyd. He operated a general store in Cannes. Willie was notorious for having a nervous jitter and continually had to have something in his hands, such as a pen or coin. Once, on a visit to the Royal Bank in St. Peter's to do his banking, he had a long chat with the manager before retuning home. When he arrived home there was an urgent message to return to the bank as he had inadvertently picked up the bank keys and put them in his pocket. They included keys to the vault and the front door.

In 1921 Willie married Mary Ellen (Nellie), the daughter of Isaac & Charlotte (Boucher) Bourque. Nellie had been working as a nurse at the Nova Scotia Hospital in Dartmouth until her marriage. They lived with Willie's dad (mom was deceased in 1921) and his two sisters Maria and Stella. In 1925 it became quite crowded in the home so Willie & Nellie built their own. In those days it seemed like it was a race as to who could have the most children in the shortest amount of time. Willie (although quite old before getting started) was going to get in on the race. He didn't have the most children in RB, but did manage to have eleven children in sixteen years. Willie passed away in 1955 and Nellie in 1993. Their children were:

Charlotte Elizabeth (Betty), 1936. California; married Wes Johnson. They have two children: Eric & Peggy Ann.

George, 1938. Sydney; married Norma Taylor. They have four children: Suzanne, Kerry, Heather & Gregory.

The following information may be of considerable interest to the families of this parish. In this time when many people are sensitized to the need to search out "family roots", I suggest that the list which I have found in the <u>oldest</u> of the Parish Registers (located on the inside page of the front cover). This document may indicate the "roots" of many of the present families of this parish. Dennis Fitzgerald, Régis Richard, Michael Fitzgerald. Cyprien Landry, Cyprien Dugat, Ferdinand Digout, Jean Landry -père, Jean Landry -fils, Damien Bourg, Edouard Bourg: Sen(ator) [?], Pierre Bourg [women, Tranquille Landry and children not included].

The priest who inscribed this very old but incomplete census states, that at the time the parish was made up of 22 Irish families (?) and 70 French families

Speculation on family name spellings:

<u>Mc or MacPhee</u> – over the years have been spelled: Macfie, McPhy and McFie

Burke –Bourque- BOURG, Bourke, Bourke, Bourk Dugas, DUGAT, Dugass, Dugast.

Another interesting historical note:

(From the oldest parish register) An entry that the Parish Church Bell was "Baptisez" i.e. given a name according to the Church Ritual on the 20th November, 1843. The Bell's Godfather was Jean Bourg and Godmother was Marie Poirier who gave the bell its name: JEAN-BAPTISTE. [very interesting!] Respectfully, Fr. MacDonald P.P. Sharon Digout
