Funeral Home



In 1987 the RBCSS Board of Directors, led by President Madeline Libbus (who also was the District Counsellor), decided it was time that River Bourgeois had a Funeral Home. A public meeting was held and a committee was formed, which included: Committee chairperson Ken Cosman Jr., George A Landry, Arthur Doary, Wayne Boudreau and Danny Landry. Following many visits to other funeral homes in the area, they looked at three possibilities from expanding the vestry, moving the now empty museum building or erecting a new building. All three options were brought to the public meeting and the decision was made to build. Many committee meetings were held, grant applications filed, land was donated by Blaise Boyd and decisions had to be made on how to raise funds. Labour was paid by a federal government grant and the community pledged monies towards supplies. Monica & Stanley McPhee collected the pledges and money poured in. In 1989 all was completed and a grand opening was held. Over the years there were many caretakers of the funeral home including: Blaise & Gretchen Landry, Sylvia & Peter Pottie, Leona & Gerald Campbell, Adrian & Tina Touesnard and Marie & Conrad Fougere.

Now, twenty-two years later, the funeral home, which is used not only by RB residence but surrounding communities, is starting to need repairs. In the last couple of years a new roof was required, the main window was replaced (along with new drapes), the kitchen floor was replaced and a vacuum cleaner was purchased. It is now time to replace the carpet, additional windows, solve the drainage and humidity problems, purchase an air conditioning unit, conduct landscaping and keep up with regular repairs. Recently a new committee was formed under the umbrella of RBCSS to look at these issues. This new committee includes: Conrad & Marie Landry, Albert Burke, Donnie Pottie, Raymond Doary and Kenneth LeBlanc. There are now "Funeral Home" donations cards placed in the funeral home for anyone wishing to make donations on behalf of the deceased.
