Patrick Fougere



Joseph Patrick was born on February 7<sup>th</sup>, 1950, the eldest of three children to Edith Mae & Simon Fougere. Patrick was welcomed home by three halfsisters: Rita, Kathleen & Theresa. They were the daughters of his mother, Edith Mae & her first husband Charlie MacDonald of Hawker. Simon & Edith Mae were fifty-eight and thirty-four years old when they wed in 1948 and had three children in three years. Patrick was the first child in the newly built River Bourgeois School to "drop out" in grade primary after three weeks. He loved the outdoors, his horse and since it was potato picking time, he felt the need to help dad was more important than schooling. He re-entered the educational system the following vear, promptly double graded and caught up with his peers. Following the completion of his schooling from St. Peter's in 1968, Patrick went to Nova Scotia Institute of Technology in Halifax to study plumbing. Unable to get enough employment to complete his 2000 hours of apprenticeship, he went to work at Strait Motors in Port Hawkesbury where he remained for the next twenty years. In 1990 Patrick left to care for his ailing mother who was suffering from cancer. It was during these long days and nights that he began to carve several different species of birds. After he mastered this craft, he went on to make many children's toys for his young nephew Robbie (Derek & Nadia were too old for toys by then). He now makes them for great-nephew Liam and greatniece Sarah. One such toy is a bus with children in it and as it hits a bump the children's heads appear (in photo). Also pictured is a model of a 1927 Chevy and a Kenworth truck, both made with exquisite detail.

After his mom's death in 1993, Patrick went to work in construction for his cousin Leo Fougere. He continued to work with Leo until 2006, when he retired for the last time. Patrick's talent does not stop at crafting - he is also a gifted carpenter. He built his sister's home next door and a few years ago he actually shrunk his house. His parent's home was rather large and, since he was alone, he decided to reduce the house by fifty percent. Because the roof was flat he was able to build an A-frame above the first level. All but the shingles were completed from within, so when he took down the exterior of the house he had this new house complete over night. Many neighbors drove by thinking they were seeing things as there was this house that was the same color and shape but had shrunk to half its size.

Patrick also built himself a cabin in the woods between his home and Richards Pond where he winters. Without any modern conveniences - including electricity - he spends his days enjoying Mother Nature. He studies and feeds the many species of birds and wildlife during the day and the flying squirrels at night. He does not do any hunting as he would rather study them in their environment. He gets occasional visits from his brother and Basil Burke. Once or twice a week he returns to his house for food and a quick visit with his sister Ann Marie and brother, John (Donnie) before returning to his camp. He loves to read about animals while in the company of his little kitten that he found under his shed. He is proud to have lived in RB all of his life. Patrick, the people of River Bourgeois wish you many years of good health, peace & serenity.


