


# The River Round Up

Maynard Boyd



Maynard Gregory was born on February 11, 1940 to Lillian (Ratchford) & Cameron Boyd of the Southside. Maynard moved to Northern Quebec as a teenager to join his brothers Hervey, Gerard, Kevin & Joe. When the Stora Pulp Mill opened in 1965 he returned to RB and remained employed with them until his retirement. Maynard was an animated character whose colourful/potty mouth was as well known as his generous heart and his antics. His friends wanted to relay some of their memories.

Maynard wanted to be a "sea captain" so after studying for many years he wrote the qualifications and did become one. He boasted that he was qualified to marry anyone as long as they were on his boat. He offered to marry his cousin Ann Boyd but she declined gracefully.

Maynard had a reputation for having a few too many spirits at times and once heard that Jimmy Burke from the lake had shot a deer so he and a friend decided that they would remove it from its location. What they were unaware of was that Jimmy had moved his outhouse to clean it out as was customary in those days. As they carried the deer on their backs, Maynard went down into the hole and was literally up to his neck in "poop". He then had to go face Jimmy

and ask for water to wash up. Jimmy is probably still laughing as they meet in the hereafter.

Maynard had borrowed dad's new car and took it down to a social at Richard's Pond. Accidently hitting a tree, leaving a few dents in the back, Maynard quickly covered the area with mud and dirt and dad never noticed or if he did never mentioned it. Last year as Maynard took a nap in his car by the marina in St. Peters, his car did a slow descent into the lake. He woke up as the water hit his face.

What most people don't know about Maynard is that after he left his drinking days behind he would spend weekends at St. Augustine Monastery supervising at the detox centre. He did this for several years until the center was relocated.

Several years ago while at the hockey rink in Port Hawkesbury, Maynard fell and hit his head on the cement floor, knocking himself out. An ambulance was called and as they crossed the causeway he woke up and demanded they take him back to the rink for the rest of the game. He caused such a disturbance that they returned him to the rink at no cost.

Maynard loved playing cards in St. Peter's and RB and did not hesitate to use some chosen words when defeated or when people made errors. Everyone learned that there was no point in getting upset over his choice of words as he couldn't care less. Maynard was generous to a fault when it came to giving. He was always the first to donate to a cause and always made sure that everyone received the mackerel he caught.

Sadly, Maynard passed away on July 22<sup>nd</sup> after years of heart, lungs & stomach ailments. He had a fond farewell at St. John the Baptist Church with a packed house of co-workers, card players, hockey players, ball players & fisherman. There were four priests in attendance: Father Dennis Lamey PP, Father Sandy MacNeil (fishing buddy), Father Hughie D MacDonald (fishing buddy) and Father Duncan MacIssac (a former co-worker and friend for many years). We're sure he was thinking everyone has lost their minds. Maynard, you had a great farewell and will be remembered always! R.I.P.

#### Wayne Burke



After graduating from St. Peter's District High in 1986, Wayne (son of Annie & the late Freddie Burke of the Southside) joined the Canadian Forces on September 16<sup>th</sup>, 1987, signing on the dotted line at the Recruit Centre in Sydney. After completing ten weeks of basic training at CFRS Cornwallis, he was posted to CFB Halifax to start his trade training as a Marine Engineer in the Navy. His first ship was HMCS MARGAREE, where he spent four and a half years, and took part in a NATO mission during the first Persian Gulf War in 1991. The following year the ship was decommissioned and he joined the Canadian Patrol Frigate (CPF) program as a member VANCOUVER. After completing HMCSShipbuilders Trials with Saint John Shipbuilding, the ship was turned over to a West Coast crew and Wavne was posted to HMCS MONTREAL to begin the process all over again. In 1992 he met his wife Denise and between deployments in 1997, they found the time to get married. From 1995 to 2000 Wavne was posted to HMCS FREDERICTON where he attained his Cert 2, Machinery Control Console Operator certification and took part in three, sixmonth European NATO deployments. Included in these deployments was one to the Adriatic Sea over Christmas in 1995 to enforce sanctions against the former Yugoslavia. After five busy years of sailing Wayne was posted ashore to the Halifax Dockyard where he spent the next two years employed as a Hydraulic Fitter. In the summer of 2002, he was posted back to HMCS FREDERICTON to continue with career training. In February 2003 Wayne & Denise became parents for the first time with the

birth of their son Ryan. Seven weeks later Wayne was deployed to the Persian Gulf during the second Gulf War. After returning home and being promoted to Master Seaman, he was posted to the Canadian Forces Naval Engineering School machine shop. In 2006, Denise gave birth to their second child Brooke and in 2007 Wayne was promoted to Petty Officer Second Class and posted to the Canadian Forces Damage Control School as a Fire Fighting Instructor. After three and a half years away from ships, Wayne returned to sea in February 2008 when he was posted to HMCS HALIFAX. There he attained his Cert 3, Engine Room Artificers certification and in February 2010 he deployed with HMCS HALIFAX to provide humanitarian aid to earthquake stricken Haiti. One year later, with 48 hours notice, Wayne deployed to the Mediterranean Sea for 6 months with HMCS CHARLOTTETOWN as part of a NATO contingent opposing the Gaddafi regime in Libya. During the deployment he received a promotion to Petty Officer First Class and at the end of the trip was posted to the Halifax Dockyard as a Job Planner/Estimator for the Fleet Maintenance Facility where he remains today. During his twenty five years in the Navy, Wayne has enjoyed travelling the world, visiting ports in Canada, USA, the Caribbean Islands, Iceland, Scotland, Ireland, England, Norway, Denmark, Germany, France, Belgium, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Gibraltar, Italy, Croatia, Malta, Greece, Turkey, Africa and the United Arab Emirates. He now enjoys his time at home with his family in Upper Tantalon and is looking forward to retirement in the near future. Thanks Wayne for serving our country.
