Cyril & Annie Landry



Annie Lauretta was born on September 15th, 1933 the 2nd of six children to Mary (Landry) & Tranquille Berthier of L'Ardoise. Following her schooling Annie went to work at the Cozy Corner before being employed as a housekeeper for the McEwens in St. Peter's. In 1953 she ventured to Halifax where she worked for Woolworths for a year. It was while she worked at the Cozy Corner that she met Freddie Burke of RB.

Freddie Pastian was born on December 28th, 1928 the seventh of sixteen children to Clara (Landry) & Joe P. Burke of the Southside. In 1945 Freddie began working on the oil tankers and remained with the company for twenty years. In 1948 while home on leave he met the beautiful Annie Berthier at the Cozy Corner. He worked for ten months of the year on the oil tankers, so even though he romanced Annie for six years he technically only dated her for a year.

Annie & Freddie were married at Holy Guardian Angels in L'Ardoise on August 16th, 1954. They had ten children: Annette in RB; Brian & Stephen in the Annapolis Valley; Glenn, Arleen, Austin, Wayne, Lee & Barry in the Halifax area and Nicole in Quebec; fifteen grandchildren and two great grand children.

Freddie continued to work on the oil tankers after their marriage until 1965 when he became employed at the Stora Pulp Mill and where he remained for the next twenty-three years. He retired in 1988 and was stricken with cancer two weeks later. Sadly he passed away in June of 1989 at age sixty-two. Annie who had been a very busy stay at home mom returned to the work scene when her three youngest children were in university/college. Cyril Joseph was born on March 1st, 1931 the thirteenth of sixteen children to Bertha (Bouchard) & Geoffrey Landry of Cannes. Cyril attended Normal College in Truro to study teaching. He taught at the Oban School for a year before joining the Air Force. Three years later in 1957, he left the forces to work at the Halifax Dockyard. It was here he studied to become an electrical officer. He worked on auxiliary & research vessels for the next thirty years retiring on October 31st, 1986 at age fifty five.

Cyril married Marjorie Clarke of Fairview on February 27th, 1954 at St. Lawrence Church. They had four children: John, Bernadette, Dorothy Ann & Blaise and four grandchildren all of whom reside in Halifax. On February 6th, 2004, sadly, Marjorie passed away just twenty-one days prior to their 50th wedding anniversary.

A few months later Cyril was visiting family in River Bourgeois when he remembered a lady he had met at the Cozy Corner some sixty years prior. He called Annie to see if she would go to Tim Horton's for a coffee. Annie had been friends for many years with Cyril's sisters Anne and Jean. She agreed to go for coffee and another love story began. They were married a year later on May 14th, 2005. Since both husbands were one of sixteen children we hope Annie doesn't have to seek a third as those credentials are getting slim.

In the beginning they made many trips between homes in RB & Halifax but soon Annie grew to love Halifax and most of the kids were nearby so the trips here are much less frequent these days. They enjoy taking walks along the boardwalk and skating. They also enjoy doing some traveling and spend a couple of weeks each winter in Florida. They have travelled to Quebec to visit Nicole and Toronto to see Annie's sister, Margaret, and plan to go to St. Anne de Beaupre again this year.
